The chief source used for the 100 2008-2009 Mark Application Questions is the *Fire Bible: Student Edition* published in 2007 by Life Publishers International, Springfield, Missouri, USA. This study Bible was chosen for two reasons. First, the wide acceptance of the scholarship and theology of the *Full Life Study Bible*, edited by Donald Stamps, from which *Fire Bible: Student Edition* was adapted. Second, the editing by Carey Huffman, Assemblies of God National Youth Ministries consultant, who made the notes understandable to middle school, junior high and senior high school students.
